GWEN SCHUIT IS NAMED PENNSYLVANIA ADVOCATE OF THE YEAR

Recognized and awarded for determined advocacy during a critical time of change by PAR (Pennsylvania Advocacy and Resources for Autism and Intellectual Disability), Gwen Schuit, the Chief Executive Officer of Friendship Community, was

awarded the PA Advocate of the Year. PAR is the Commonwealth's leading association representing providers who support people with autism or intellectual disability. Gwen received her award at the PAR Annual Solutions Conference "We Are Worth It" Awards Ceremony in October at the Harrisburg Hilton Hotel. PAR is the statewide association dedicated to ensuring, strengthening and promoting the ability of community-based provider organizations to support people with autism or intellectual disability and their families.

A six-year member of the PAR Board of Directors, Gwen was chosen for this award due to her diligent efforts in engaging people with autism and intellectual disability and their family members, as well as direct support professionals, advocating to local legislators within their district and the Capitol on behalf of the disability provider community for improving supports and services throughout the Commonwealth. Her advocacy with legislators was also extended to the national level.

Her devotion to this work comes from her deep belief that serving others and making a difference in people's lives is her calling in life. Gwen is honored, loved and respected by her colleagues, the people she serves, and employees.

Shirley Walker, President and CEO of PAR saluted Gwen for "her sense of deep devotion to ensuring that every person with autism or a developmental disability is honored for their humanity and gifts to the world."

Walker continued, "Gwen's heart and personal devotion to improving the lives of people with disabilities touches all with whom she interacts. Legislators listen to her and respect her because they know that she is advocating with all her heart for a cause in which she deeply believes."

Chalk the Block


An empty parking lot, pieces of sidewalk chalk and over 80 Community Members and Heart Gallery Artists was all it took to bring to life a large mural at Friendship Heart Gallery's first ever Chalk the Block Event.

In collaboration with Lancaster City Alliance, the Gallery planned this event to coincide with the Downtown Arts Celebration occurring in conjunction with the PA Governor's Arts Awards. Steeple View Loft residents, Robert Fulton Elementary School Students, City Residents and Heart Artists worked side-by-side to make this unique creation.

The image, inspired by local Artist Vania Hardy's original work entitled "Where the Heart is," was gridded off into 30 blocks. Each participant received a print-out that was a small portion of the larger image they then had to replicate in an 11' by 11' square on the lot in front of the Gallery.

Each Community Member and Heart Artist used their own interpretation of what they saw and collaborated to create the final, unified image. After the mural was completed, a drone captured an aerial shot of the image (bottom right).

Chalk the Block was a beautiful reminder that while we may all have different abilities and perspectives, when we come together as a community, we are able to accomplish amazing things!





Business "Frame" Supports Others

It's interesting how a "light bulb" moment can put the focus on what really matters.

That's how Friendship Community became one of many local non-profits that benefit from the vision and generosity of ModernEYES Optical owners Jon Ressler, Chad Weaver and Ralph Scott (above left to right).

Friendship Community Team Members and their families obtain eyeglasses at discounted rates at ModernEYES; in addition, a percentage of those sales goes right back to the organization at the end of the year, amounting to thousands of dollars. ModernEYES has also donated eyewear to several Friendship Community Individuals in need.

"We've been in business 11 years," Ressler said recently. "The first five years, we were having fun and making as much money as possible." When his daughter survived a complicated childbirth, however, he said, he began to re-examine his former disinterest in matters of faith. And, as his new Christianity unfolded, so too, did his perspective on success.

Ressler said an invitation to attend a Friendship Community dinner contributed to his sense that ModernEYES, in Lancaster, could play an altruistic role in the larger community. "I started to think, if Friendship didn't offer care for persons with disabilities, what would be the alternative? And it's not good."

He was gripped by the realization that people with disabilities can truly give love and truly be loved. And, Ressler added, "Some of the caregivers I've met are the most quality people you will meet. Genuine, caring people."

"I just had a light bulb go over my head one day," he said. So he talked with his partners, who were already long-practicing men of faith; and with input from their staff, they developed ways to work charity into their everyday business plan. Subsequently, ModernEYES has donated more than \$60,000 to participating nonprofits.

God's light shines! Amen.


