If you have a calling to serve adults with disabilities and are looking for a rewarding opportunity to enrich your family's life, you may be interested in becoming a Lifesharing Host.

- What is a Lifesharing Host? A Lifesharing Host is an adult, 21 years or older, who opens their family home to an adult with developmental or intellectual disabilities to live with them.
- What do I receive as a Lifesharing Host? You will receive supportive monthly monitoring, training opportunities to enhance your skills and knowledge, a team approach to supporting the individual who lives with you, and a monthly stipend.

This experience will impact the life of an adult with disabilities . . . while enriching your own!

- How will this opportunity impact my daily life? The Individual becomes integrated in your family's life – becoming a valued “member of the family.” Friendship Community requests that a Lifesharing Host commit to at least 2 years of providing service. However, we often see Lifesharing Hosts continue to serve far beyond their initial contract.
